1ST GRADE BIBLE

PHILOSOPHY STATEMENT:

Development of a Biblical worldview based on God's Word is the foundation for living the Christian life. Immersing students in Scripture content begins at an early age through grade-level Bible curriculum and biblical integration in every core curriculum. The study of God's Word leads students to the acquisition of knowledge, understanding, and wisdom, guiding them in the development of godly inner character and the pursuit of a personal saving relationship with Jesus Christ. Students' spiritual, emotional, and intellectual needs are met as they commit Scripture to memory, lead an active prayer life, and apply biblical truths daily.

COURSE OBJECTIVE:

The objective of this course is for students to explore the Bible, engage in a thorough and personalized examination of chosen Biblical passages, and take part in activities aimed at applying the Scriptures to key challenges encountered by first grade students. The instructional materials are designed to spark students' Interest, prompting thoughtful reflection and fostering a Christ-like mindset. The primary focus centers on learning to study the Bible and understanding principles that serve as a guide throughout life. Students will learn how to integrate Biblical truths into their lives. They will also receive instruction on how Bible truths help them understand God's creation biblically. An emphasis will also be placed on teaching students the importance and various aspects of discipleship.

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1ST GRADE SCIENCE

PHILOSOPHY STATEMENT:

The natural world was created by the word of God and reveals facets of the character and nature of God. Science is taught through problem solving, hands-on experiments, observation and conclusions. Science education should provide students with an understanding of His created world, creating a sense of awe and wonder concerning God. Foundations of science understanding can be used for further study and academic preparation to equip students to compassionately care for people and wisely steward creation.

COURSE OBJECTIVE:

The objective of this course is to introduce students to what science is and what scientists do. Students will learn to defend the truth that God created all things and sustains their existence, to explain how the design of living things meets their needs for growth and survival, and to analyze the patterns of the earth, the sun, the moon, and the stars. They will also explain the properties of light, sound, and communication using both. Through inquiry-based activities, students have the opportunity to apply foundational science process skills to develop orderly approaches to problem-solving.
